IV. Masterclass: Navigating AI in Research Management

AI is no longer a future topic for research management. It is already reshaping how we search for opportunities, support proposals, manage projects, communicate results, analyze information, and make decisions under pressure. At the same time, the tools are multiplying, expectations are rising, and many research managers are left with the same difficult question: *what should we use, and how do we use it safely and strategically?*

This hands-on masterclass is designed to provide practical answers. Over two days, participants move from uncertain experimentation to a more confident, structured, and purposeful use of AI in research management. You will learn to navigate the AI policy landscape, identify where AI adds real organizational value, and even build simple, customized AI assistants for your daily tasks.

Format:

- Day 1 (Hybrid - Online/In-person): Strategy, policy, and essential AI skills.
- Day 2 (In-person only): Practical, hands-on tool building.

V. Webinar: Lump Sum Funding in Horizon Europe

On 12 November 2026, the European Commission will host its next information session: *“Lump Sum Funding in Horizon Europe: How does it work? How to write a proposal?”*.

Horizon Europe uses lump sum funding to reduce administration and financial errors. Lump sums make the programme simpler by removing the need to report actual costs. This means easier access to the programme, especially for small organisations and newcomers, who often lack the experience and capacity to cope with the complex rules for actual costs.

Lump sums are defined up-front and fixed in the grant agreement. They are paid upon completion of the activities in work packages. Beyond that, the planning, evaluation, and execution of projects does not change much. In particular, the payment of lump sums is not dependent on successful outcomes (which are never certain in research) and follows the standard payment schedule. Lump sum projects enjoy the same degree of flexibility, and their performance is judged by the same standards.

This informative event might be of interest for those who are interested in submitting bids to upcoming Horizon Europe calls for proposals that use the lump sum funding model. The event is free of charge and registration is not required.
